Rotary eClub One

This week is an excellent opportunity to let you know how you can improve your attendance record for the club.

Rotary eClub One is the world's first web-based Rotary club and is just like any traditional Rotary club. The only difference is that members meet online to coordinate service projects and enjoy fellowship with like-minded Rotarians.

There are two basic requirements when you visit <http://www.rotaryclubone.org/> for a makeup credit:

FIRST - Click on the Make-up Programs link in the grey panel above and spend 30 minutes or more reading program articles and viewing video content. Next click on the Request Makeup link in the grey panel.

It is a mandatory requirement that Rotarians spend at least 30 minutes on the Rotary eClub One website to qualify for a make-up credit.

Please use your 30 minute visit to review a variety of articles from their Programs section and/or information from our web site pages. As always, Rotarians should apply the 4-Way Test to the time they spend on the Rotary eClub One site for a make-up.

Everyday there are articles being submitted to the website. At last count there were 127 makeup articles some of which were videos and over 100 more in the archives.

SECOND - Click on the link in the grey panel named Request Makeup and follow the instructions.

If you select check: Click on "I will send check" and you will be taken to a "Thank You" page with a button to "Request Makeup Form."

If you select no contribution: You will be provided another opportunity to consider a

donation to help keep the site available and a link to the "Request Makeup Form."

Important steps for a complete makeup: Most fields require a response, which will be printed on your makeup form. Please be very careful to enter the date missed in the format shown (mm/dd/yy) to include the "/".

There is an e-mail field allowing you to send a copy to your club attendance officer. Insert Om's email address: madhok@minot.com or simply give Om a call to let him know you did a makeup online.

They don't have a "rubber chicken" meal, but are there 24/7 to enable you to complete a makeup. You are asked to consider a contribution that would equal the price of a meal to support this site and continue the many Rotary eClub One projects.

Rotary eClub One welcomes submission of non-commercial news articles that will inform and inspire our large international audience of Rotarians and other visitors. Each story they receive will be considered for publication, however Rotary eClub One cannot guarantee that a story, and any pictures it may include, will be published.

They reserve the right to edit any article, however we will not make changes that affect the accuracy of the story.

Please note that the website policy prohibits requests for donations for any project in which Rotary eClub One is not involved.

They do not allow embedded hyperlinks to other websites because visiting Rotarians must stay on our site for at least 30 minutes to qualify for a make-up attendance credit.

Guest Speaker March 29, 2010



Our guest speaker this week was **Ann B. Jenks**, Director, State Archives at the North Dakota Heritage Center in Bismarck.

State Historical Society of North Dakota acquires, preserves and makes available to the public documents, photographs and all types of visual files.

Among those are township, county and state records as well as naturalization records, assessments, oil and gas, civil, criminal and probates.

These files are most often used by genealogists researching their family history.

The historical society has a sizable film collection of newspapers, news footages from television stations back

dating back to the 1950s. You will also find tourism footage going back 40 years.

Weekly and daily newspapers that have been archived can be loaned out through your local library.

Families have donated items throughout the years especially when a relative passes away and the family does not wish to toss out letters, diaries and other important papers that document history. On display are letters from soldiers who served in World War I.

The State Historical Society is working on putting these items online saving you a trip to Bismarck. Visit their site: <http://www.digitalhorizonsonline.org/> for audio interviews, maps, photos and letters.

Ann took two large containers of the Rotary Club of Minot's *Prairie Flower* to Bismarck. Let's the archiving begin!
